- 3860** Prisoners until the end of the first half of this year 2023
- 5000** Prisoners until the end of June 2023 including:
  - 32** Women prisoners and
  - 160** minor
- 1800** Prisoners from Jerusalem, which is the largest number among prisoners
- 568** Minor prisoners among the total number of prisoners.
- 72** Women prisoners, some have been released.
- 1132** Administrative detainees including:
  - 3** Women and **18** minors.
- 1608** Orders for administrative detention including:
  - 813** new order.
  - 795** renewal order for different time period.
  - 1001** arrest case in April 2023.
- %80** Of administrative detainees are former prisoners, who were mostly administrative detainees.
- 60** Administrative detainees proceed boycotting Israeli Military Courts.
- 201** Prisoner from Jericho, specifically from Aqabat Jaber Refugee Camp during the first half of this year.

- 291** Prisoner from Jenin and its refugee camp until the end of June 2023.
- 215** Prisoner from Nablus in relevance to a large scale of Israeli violations and war crimes associated to these cases of arrest.
- However, Jerusalem and Hebron still remain the highest two cities in terms of number of arrest.
- 4** Houses of prisoners were demolished:  
The prisoner Younis Helan.  
The prisoner Islam Froukh.  
The prisoner Osama Taweel.  
The prisoner Kamal Joury.
- The demolishing has also caused severe and dangerous psychological effects of prisoners' families' especially children
- 2** Martyr prisoners since the beginning of 2023 due to medical negligence:  
The prisoner Ahmad Abu-Ali.  
The prisoner Khader Adnan who was deliberately assassinated after 86 days of hunger strike.
- 11** Corpses of martyr prisoners remain detained
- 700** ill prisoners including:  
**24** Prisoners suffering from different levels of cancer and tumours Prominently Walid Daqqa who has been arrested for 38 years and is suffering from a rare type of spinal cord cancer.  
Also, the prisoner Assef Rifai who was arrested in September 2022.

Prisoners who suffer from psychological or chronic illnesses.

Ahmad Manasra, who remains detained and confined despite his serious psychological and physical condition.

Mohammed Khalil, the oldest prisoner in confinement as he remains in solitary confinement for more than 15 years now.

**558** Prisoners sentenced to life imprisonment including:

**6** Prisoners who have been sentenced to life since the beginning of 2023:

- Alaa Kabha from Jenin.
- Muath Hamed from Silwad.
- Yousef Assi.
- Yahya Mari from Salfit.
- Zaid Amer from Nablus.
- Mahmoud Atawneh from Hebron.

**22** Old prisoners who have been arrested prior to Oslo agreements in 1993 and remain

Except for the release of 3 prisoners due to finishing their sentence:

- Kareem Younis.
- Maher Younis.
- Basheer Khatib.

The oldest prisoner now is Mohammed Tous who remains in prison since 1985.
