



Statistics about Palestinian Prisoners

- 5200** Palestinian Prisoners and Detainees. This is the total number divided among 24 prisons, detention and interrogation centres.
- 5000** Detention cases since the beginning of the year including:
 - 83** Female Prisoners.
 - 678** Minor Prisoners.
- 36** Female Prisoners.
- 160** Minor Prisoners under 18 years.
- 1300** Administrative Detainees.
- 22** Old Prisoners arrested prior to Oslo Accords.
- 450** Prisoners who have spent more than 20 years in prison.
- 573** Prisoners serving a lifetime sentence.
- 237** Martyr among the Prisoners' Movement since 1967.
- 11** Detained Martyr Prisoners' bodies
- 700** Ill Prisoners.
- 2** Prisoners on Hunger Strike.
- 19** Detained Journalists.
- 3** Parliament Member Prisoners.
- 47** Prisoners rearrested after being released in "Wafaa Al-Ahrar" Deal.



Administrative Detainees

1300 Administrative Detainees in Israeli Prisons until the end of August 2023 including:

20 Minor Administrative Detainees.

4 Female Administrative Detainees.

362 Administrative Detention orders in August including:

230 New Administrative Detention orders.

132 Renewed Administrative Detention orders
Especially among released prisoners.

111 Appeal Files submitted by the “Prisoners and Ex-Detainees Affairs Authority” against administrative detention orders, mostly rejected by Israeli courts without any convincing or reasonable explanation.

2350 Administrative Detention orders since the beginning of 2023 including:

1245 New Administrative Detention orders.

1105 Renewed Administrative Detention orders.

2 Administrative Detainees on Hunger Strike:
Kayed Fafous.

Sultan Khlouf.

They have been on strike for more than 40 days in rejection of their administrative detention. They have been arrested numerous times, and have gone on hunger strike before.



Jerusalemite Detainees

1800 Jerusalemite Detainees arrested in the first half of 2023 including:

208 Minors.

56 Women.

130 Jerusalemite Detainees arrested during August 2023 including:

More than **27** Minors.

6 Women.

8 Administrative Detention orders against prisoners from Jerusalem including:
- Former Minister of Jerusalem, who has been exiled, Khaled Abu- Arafa.
- Exiled MP Ahmed Attoun.

House arrest for Jerusalemites

194 House Arrest orders during the first half of 2023, recording the highest in April, with **57** orders, ranging from two days up to any unspecified time limit.

20 House Arrest orders against Jerusalemites during August, including 10 orders against children.

House Arrest is a means imposed by Israeli occupation authority against Palestinians in occupied territories, especially Jerusalemites. It aims at punishing and abusing them, mostly imposed upon minors.

House Arrest is an act of detaining someone inside his/her home for a period of time, through which an Israeli court examines his/her file, takes judicial procedures and announces a final verdict in the case. The period of detention is unlimited, it might range from a couple of days to weeks or months or even years.

Prisoners Distribution according to their Factional Membership:

- 2347** Prisoners from the Palestinian National Liberation Movement (Fateh).
- 1117** Prisoners from the Islamic Resistance Movement (Hamas).
- 503** Prisoners from Palestinian Islamic Jihad Movement.
- 300** Prisoners from the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine.
- 98** Prisoners from the Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine.
- 835** Prisoners from other Factions.

Prisoners Distribution according to their Status of Detention:

- 1700** Detainees awaiting trial.
- 2100** Prisoners sentenced by Military Courts.
- 1300** Administrative Detainees held based on “secret evidence” without any charge or trial.



Martyrs of the Palestinian Prisoners' Movement

- 237** Prisoner Martyrs since 1967 including:
- 73** Prisoners died under torture.
 - 81** Prisoners died due to Medical Negligence.
 - 76** Prisoners executed immediately after being arrested.
 - 7** Prisoners died during custody due to gunshot injuries.
